**Health Care Reform**

Health Care Reform is a critical issue facing our country. President Obama has correctly identified health care reform as a priority for our time that must be successfully addressed. We have existing shortages of primary care physicians in Family, Internal, and Pediatric Medicine, the "front line " of medical care for most patients. We must address those needs quickly if we hope to be able to meet the expectations of our citizens.

And we must then find a way to provide sustainable method of paying for such insurance and care that will allow our country to be competitive in the global economy.

These are very large challenges, and we must have a national consensus on how to achieve these goals. Physicians will be active leaders in these discussions, and we will continue to care for our patients and advocate for their well being.
