INTENT and OVERVIEW

More efficient detection and treatment of ophthalmic conditions and diseases are constantly being discovered and acted upon. This program is based on the need to apprise local physicians of the diagnostic modalities and treatments being utilized at teaching centers and ophthalmologic offices across the country.

MEETING OBJECTIVES

This course will highlight the recent developments regarding diagnosis as well as medical and surgical therapy of common eye diseases. The participant should get a comprehensive review of the most current concepts in the management of ophthalmology by experts across the breadth of the field. For example, clinical trials and other evidence in the peer-reviewed literature over the past few years have changed the approach to managing cataract including IOL technology and femtosecond laser cataract surgery, corneal disease including dry eye disease, keratoplasty, and collagen cross linking, glaucoma, and minimally invasive glaucoma surgical devices, as well as diabetic retinopathy, macular degeneration, and retinal vein occlusions. This course also includes legislative updates as it pertains to Ophthalmologists and their practice. At the conclusion of this meeting, participants should be able to:

- Update their knowledge of diagnosis and treatment of common and rare ophthalmic diseases.
- Identify major advances in key areas of cutting-edge research and technology in Ophthalmology.
- Identify (appropriately) subsets of patients who may benefit from new treatment paradigms, diagnostic testing, or surgical
 interventions.
- Develop a differential diagnosis for a refractive surprise
- Understand the leading factors which predict an individual's health outcomes
- Examine the barriers to achieving eye health equity; propose approaches for health equity
- Review common biases in medical decision making
- Recommend methods to prevent cognitive bias
- Incorporate new treatment paradigms, diagnostic approaches, and surgical techniques into current clinical practice.
- Review the structure and evolution of the DRCR Retina Network.
- Present the most important clinical trials the Network has performed over the last two decades.
- Review clinical trial methodology, how we select trials, and why we sometimes choose not to do a trial.
- Address the scope of the problem of severe glaucoma.
- Review, modify, and hone surgical skills and approaches to specific eye problems and clinical situations.
- Develop strategies to identify and address their own individual professional practice gaps.
- Gain an understanding of the diagnostic process and the significance of diagnostic error.
- Document care in a timely manner, including the thought process underlying management of various situations, such as ruling out differential diagnoses, treatment plans, etc.
- Learn how to answer questions about the success of surgery in alleviating symptoms.





The Pittsburgh Ophthalmology Society is honored to welcome Danie F. Martin, MD the 43rd Annual Harvey E. Thorpe Lecturer.

Daniel F. Martin, MD is the Chair of the Cole Eye Institute at Cleveland Clinic. In this role, he is responsible for the Institute's strategic growth in all areas, including clinical and surgical care of patients, safety and quality, research, education and philanthropy. Dr. Martin is also the Barbara and A. Malachi Mixon III Institute Chair in Ophthalmology. He is a Professor of Ophthalmology at the Cleveland Clinic Lerner College of Medicine.

Dr. Martin serves as the Network Chair for the DRCR Retina Network. He previously served as the Study Chair for the Comparison of AMD Treatments Trials (CATT) and has served as Study Chair for many other national clinical trials including those that led to FDA approval of the ganciclovir implant and valganciclovir. Dr. Martin has served as PI, member of the DSMC, and/or member of the Steering Committee for dozens of other studies including AREDS, SOCA, and MUST.

He has published more than 220 peer-reviewed articles, delivered 44 named lectures, and delivered more than 520 invited lectures. Dr Martin has served in numerous society leadership roles including currently as President of the Macula Society.

Dr. Martin has been the recipient of numerous awards including the 74th Edward Jackson Memorial Lecture, the AAO Lifetime Achievement Award, the AAO Secretariat Award, the AAO Senior Achievement Award, the Heed-Gutman Award from the Society of Heed Fellows, the J. Donald M. Gass Medal from the Macula Society, the Roger Johnson Award in AMD Research from the University of Washington, the Pyron Award and the Crystal Apple Award from the American Society of Retina Specialists (ASRS), the Rosenthal Young Investigator Award from the Macula Society, the Sam and Maria Miller Award for Scientific Achievement in Clinical Research from the Cleveland Clinic, the J. Donald M. Gass Lectureship Award from the Retina Society, the Lifetime Achievement Award for Excellence in Clinical Trials, and the Cless Medal. Dr Martin has previously served on the Board of Governors for the Cleveland Clinic.






